The information from the new system will enable the Commission and the Boards manage and streamline its productivity programs through informed and evidencebased decisions.

The NWPC was founded on July 1, 1989.

- The first Executive Director of NWPC is Carmelita Pineda.
- The NWPC has had three full-pledged Executive Directors namely Carmelita Pineda, Ciriaco Lagunzad III, and Maria Criselda R. Sy.
- NWPC's past Executive Directors have been promoted as DOLE Undersecretary.
- Republic Act 6971 is known as Productivity Incentives Act of 1990.
- The logo of NWPC was designed by Ms. Asuncion Calapan, a former employee of the National Productivity Commission (NPC) who now works at the Philippine Deposit Insurance Corporation.
- The NWPC was a merger of National Wages Council (NWC) and National Productivity Commission (NPC).
- The NWPC was first located at the 3rd and 4th floors of Licaros Building in Intramuros, Manila, which is now occupied and owned by the Bayleaf Hotel.
- The last national minimum wage was mandated under RA 6727 in the amount of P89.
- ISTIV PAP was the first productivity training program of NWPC launched in September 1998.
- RTWPB-NCR was the first to set a regional minimum wage.
- The Two-Tiered Wage System was adopted as an approach to minimum wage setting in 2012.
- As of June 2017, there are 86 minimum wage rates in the Philippines.
- NWPC received its first unqualified COA opinion in 2017.
- The longest serving Executive Director of NWPC is Undersecretary Ciriaco A. Lagunzad III.

- RTWPB-CAR was the first to issue a wage order for domestic workers.
- The logo of NWPC's Service Quality training program was designed by Ms. Celeste Maring, a former employee of NWPC.
- RTWPB-CAR is the only regional board that has consistently produced Productivity Olympics national winners since 2008.
- NWPC obtained Maturity Level III under the Civil Service Commission's (CSC) Program to Institutionalize Meritocracy and Excellence in Human Resource Management (PRIME-HRM) for initiating innovations in HR management programs and systems in March 2017.
- Today, the highest monthly minimum wage for domestic workers is P3,500 for workers in chartered cities and first class municipalities in the Ilocos Region.
- According to the Komisyon sa Wikang Filipino, the correct translation of National Wages and Productivity Commission is Pambansang Komisyon sa Pasahod at Produktibidad.
- The DOLE Secretary is the Chairperson of NWPC.
- The NWPC and RTWPBs received the 2009 Presidential Citation for its best practice in implementing ISTIV Productivity Training Program among MSMEs.
- At present, the highest daily minimum wage rate is P491 in the National Capital Region while the lowest is P235 in MIMAPORA Region.
- The NWPC-Employees Association was founded in 1995.
- NWPC received its ISO 9001:2015 certification in March 2016.
- RTWPB-VI has issued the most number of wage orders at 23.
- Seven Board Secretaries have been promoted as either DOLE Regional or Assistant Regional Directors.
